Enjoy a background talk on the making of glass and the different ways it has been used throughout the centuries. We will go around the globe and through time as Sheryl takes us on an exploration for examples from Egypt...to Greek and Roman mosaics...through Medieval Stained Glass....up to the Metropolitan Museum's amazing collection of Louis Comfort Tiffany glass artwork of all kinds.

Whether it is art glass, stained glass, blown glass or pressed glass, its iridescence has always held our interest.

After lunch (at Met's cafeteria) we will be treated to an **exclusive visit of the Luce Collection** led by the **Curator of American Decorative Arts** - highlighting several examples of glass and silver in this 'store room' of treasures. Time permitting we will visit several of the relevant period rooms.
