Monday, December 9, 2013

Sheryl Intrator Urman, lecturer, artist and teacher will give us an overview of the life and times of Marc Chagall including his role as a pioneer of modernism and as a major Jewish artist at the **West Orange JCC**.

After a delicious dairy lunch, a bus will be waiting to take us to the **The Jewish Museum** in New York City.

Enjoy a docent tour of *Chagall: Love, War, and Exile*, for the first time in the U.S., exploring a significant but neglected period in the artist's career from the rise of fascism in the 1930s through 1948, years spent in Paris and then in exile in New York. Marc Chagall, one of the foremost modernists of the 20th century, created his unique style by drawing on elements from richly colored folk art motifs, the Russian Christian icon tradition, Cubism, and Surrealism.
